Wildacres is situated on 1600 acres at an elevation of 3,300 feet atop a mountain near the Blue Ridge Parkway in Little Switzerland, North Carolina. The 5-day program costs about \$370 per person including room, board and classroom instruction (plus a nominal fee to cover materials and supplies); completed projects can be taken home with you. The week at Wildacres is divided into two parts or "semesters": students take one class lasting either the full week (4-days) or two different classes lasting 2-days each. The day between "semesters" is set aside to allow participants to explore the region and just relax. It doesn't get any better than that!!
