# April 2015 Field Trips by Mark Leipert

**April 11<sup>th</sup> Odessa Delaware Petrified Wood Trip, Saturday, 08:45 at Centenary Church in Berlin**: Petrified Wood at the John Wolf Memorial Trip - John was an avid fossil collector from the Calvert Marine Museum Fossil Club and the Delaware Valley Paleontological Society. The Calvert Club runs this fossil collecting trip to Odessa, DE every year. John had a heart attack a few years ago and pass away. They now renamed the trip in his honor. We will meet up at a farm in Odessa, DE and collect petrified wood (cypress from the Pleistocene, probably 1.5-2 million years old). No special tools or equipment is necessary. You should probably leave your tools in your car or at home. This is a no-till farm and we don't want to do anything to cause erosion. Sign-up and direction will be given at the April 8<sup>th</sup> meeting.



**Sterling Hill Super Dig, April 25<sup>th</sup>:** Mark your calendars for our Annual Sterling Hill Super Dig which is put on by our club and which will take place on Saturday, April 25<sup>th</sup>. This event gets bigger and better every year. Last year we had over 260 people attending this event. We need volunteers to make it work.
