

This talk will discuss Colorado's "Gold Rush," as well as silver, and a few dozen other commodities with recorded production, from ancient to modern times. Some attention will be given to the innovations needed for the growth of Colorado mining, the mineralogy of several of these commodities, and chances for future production of "green energy" materials. These are some of the topics to be discussed during this talk.


