

## **President's Message**

Thank you very much for your confidence in voting me, once again, as President of DVESS. This year I celebrated my 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary in the club, having attended my first meeting in September of 1984, and having served on the Executive Board since January of 1985. I will do my best to preserve the DVESS legacy and maintain the standards of the **Eastern Federation of Mineralogical and Lapidary Societies**, our "parent" organization, and the **American Federation of Mineralogical Societies**, our "grandparent" organization.

It is important to note that an irregularity occurred during the election. I nominated Mel for the Presidency, which was followed immediately by an objection from the floor; someone stated that in order to be elected to this position, one would have to have previously served as an officer on the Executive Board.

As the person offering the objection was unable to document his belief, and as none of the Executive Board members present was able, at that moment, to substantiate the rationale, the position of president defaulted to the previously nominated slate (with myself as president) and an impromptu Board meeting was held after the general meeting ended; at that time the Constitution of the club was scrutinized. Under the section about who may be elected to an office, the Constitution states in a single sentence that any member may be elected to any position. There is no other requirement.

In light of this unusual situation, President Mark Leipert, whose term officially expired at the end of December, will remain as Acting President until a special election is held January 14th.

Altho the President brings to that position their own personal style and ideas, I have always maintained that any member interested in holding any position on the Board can nominate themselves (or be nominated) with great confidence, because it is actually the Executive Board that "runs" the club. No Board member is out there all alone with a sole, potentially overwhelming, responsibility; it's a team effort. Be sure to look elsewhere in this newsletter for a message from Acting President Mark Leipert.

## Interim President's Report: Mark Leipert




