# **Field Trip**

## Fossil Hunting at Calvert Cliffs by Kayak - Saturday, June 5, 2021

Bad weather (including choppy water) cancels -- rain date is Saturday June 19, 2021

We will be paddling for about 3-4 hours total (half before we explore the beaches and have lunch, and half to return to our cars) depending on conditions, so you must be in reasonably

good condition to do this trip. It can be fairly strenuous and is not a beginner paddle -- this is on the Chesapeake! PFDs (life vests) required. If you bring your own kayak, 12' or longer is recommended.

Meet Sue VanCola at 10 AM June 5 at Breezy Point Campground beach. #### **Fossils**

The area has a variety of Miocene fossils, primarily shark teeth (lots of Snaggletooth sharks, nice Makos, Cow sharks and Tiger sharks -- and there is always the possibility of a Meg!) and ray plates, as well as some invertebrates and mammals. It is difficult for non-residents to gain access to private beaches at the Cliffs, so this is a fun way of doing so. It is picturesque and we usually see Bald Eagles as well as many other bird species. For further information on fossils one would likely find at these beaches:


