"The Permian / Triassic Extinction Event –

The Worst Dying of All Time"

This lecture will tell you a story of the greatest extinction event in all the Earth's prehistory. Hint: it had nothing to do with a giant meteorite falling from the sky. The

Earth's own climate went haywire and into a downward spiral which lasted for a million years. Studying the past is the key to the future.

My passion for fossil collecting started when I was 10 years old and has never stopped since. Starting at the age of 14, I worked in a rock shop (Jim's Gems) in Wayne NJ and gleaned a vast knowledge for the collecting and lapidary hobby. For the past 27 years, my collection has grown to include fossil amber, fish, reptiles, and mammals that are unique to New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, and Maryland. I also collect local minerals from New Jersey, shells, bones, meteorites and other natural history items and artifacts. This hobby has brought me too many interesting localities and fascinating people. I also maintain a web site on my favorite fossil collecting site, Big Brook at njfossils.net. To date, I would guess that my favorite fossil that I found is the insect (a blood sucking Midge that may have feed on dinosaurs) that I found in Cretaceous aged sediment in Sayreville NJ. It was new to science and was eventually named after me (*Culicoides yoosti*).

At our **November 10th** meeting, we have **Dr. Karen Wenrich** who will be sharing her experiences in the mining industry at the "Sweet Home Mine in Alma, Colorado" and showing us some fantastic minerals collected from the mine. I will continue trying to line-up interesting speakers for the fall and winter months.

Field Trips:

Our annual free trip to **Sterling Hill** has been moved to **Saturday, October 23rd**. We will be meeting at our favorite parking spot at the Wood Crest Station of the PATCO High Speed Line at 8:00. I'm checking on the ability to do some mineral collecting for a short time.

Saturday, October 30th, we will be going to a local stream in Sewell to collect Cretaceous fossils. We will be meeting in the Lowes parking lot at 9:00 am. You'll need boots for walking in the stream, a long handled shovel, a ½" to 3/8" screen and frame, bucket and containers.

Other potential field trips include the **National Limestone Quarry** sometime in November and the **C&D Canal** and **Odessa Petrified Wood** locality. Stay tuned for details.

Fossil Fair and Mineral Treasures Show for 2021: Postponed due to COVID-19. This show is rescheduled for the last weekend in March 2022.


