Minutes of the October 9th, 2003 DVESS General Meeting.

Thirty-two people turned out for the October meeting to see the legendary George Powell talk about fossils. Grant called the meeting to order at 8:10. After introducing our guest, Adriana Amado (Jonathan Feigin's neighbor), Gary turned the meeting over to George Powell.

George brought an impressive display of fossils, mostly from Aurora, NC and the Potomac River, and some rare specimens. He talked about his famous find in 1992, a shark dentition (full set of teeth from one shark), and collecting in general, especially at Aurora. Next spring the phosphate mine company (PSC) at Aurora will allow collectors in the pit. Currently, collectors are only allowed to pick through the piles of dumped material. After his talk, George distributed handouts on curating a collection. The Junior Rockhounds presented George with a specimen plaque as a thank you.

We took a break to look at the fossil specimens before proceeding to the business part of the meeting. The minutes for both June and September were approved as printed in the newsletter. Gary gave the treasurer's report, and explained the types of expenses the club has, such as insurance for field trips, postage for the newsletter, and subsidies for our trips and the upcoming banquet.

We discussed the club's need for officers for the upcoming year. Stu Cleveland offered to take over membership duties. The banquet scheduled for the upcoming Sunday was promoted; it will feature a showing of SuperCroc, a documentary about a huge crocodile fossil found in the Sahara.

The door prize of a whale earbone was won by Stu Cleveland. Jonathan Feigin won a fossil plaque. The meeting adjourned at 10:00.

George Powell was in good spirits and good health, after having beat the cancer that hit him two years ago. It was great to have him return for our meeting, and he was still holding court in the parking lot when I finally drove away at 11:00 pm.
