LECTURE: Becoming Human

Sunday, January 25, 2004, 3:00-5:00 p.m.

"How and when did we become fully human?" "When did homo sapiens become capable of symbolic reasoning, thought and language?" Ian Tattersall, one of this country's leading anthropologists, asks these questions as he examines the major events in human evolution over the past four-million plus years. Join him as he explores the archeological record that early humans left behind in cave painting, engraving, carving, bodily decoration, music, elaborate burial with grave goods and other behaviors. Learn why Dr. Tattersall believes that human evolution is an eventful story of evolutionary experimentation with new species constantly generated and regular extinctions taking place. Explore the reasons why homo sapiens are the lone hominid in the world today.

SPEAKER: Ian Tattersall, paleontologist, evolutionary biologist and primate behaviorist, is Curator of Anthropology at The American Museum of Natural History. 
